Deputy Mayor Meringolo requested that the Planning and Zoning Administrator's position be eliminated from the Ordinance at this time. After a brief discussion, all agreed and the Ordinance was revised as noted.

MOVED by: Committeeman Piserchia of the Township Committee of the Township of Long Hill that Ordinance #15-362 be approved AS REVISED on first reading with the public hearing scheduled for September 9, 2015. **SECONDED by:** Committeeman Dorsi **ROLL CALL VOTE:** All in favor

COMMITTEE LIAISON REPORTS:

Deputy Mayor Meringolo reported for the BOE that schools would be open on September 3rd. HPAC was not awarded the County grant to complete the unfinished interior section of the Millington Schoolhouse. There is currently \$80,000.00 in the Historic portion of the Open Space, Recreation, Farmland and Historic Preservation Trust which is not sufficient to complete the project. The HPAC is preparing some options to present to the Township Committee. The Open House for the Millington Schoolhouse will be in conjunction with the kickoff for the celebration of 150th Anniversary of the Township in 2016. The Open House will be scheduled sometime in October 2015.

Committeeman Dorsi read the monthly report from the Department of Public Works

Committeeman Piserchia noted that the award for the FLAP Grant has been delayed for 2 weeks. If the Township is awarded the grant to repair Whitebridge Road, the grant is issued by monthly requisition to the contractor directly, not to the Township. Therefore, the work cannot begin in the interim until the grant is awarded. After a brief discussion it was decided that Mr. Sweeney would schedule with Tilcon for the latest possible date for the road repair in order to get on their schedule for 2015 with the hopes that if the grant is awarded to the Township the work could begin immediately.

DISCUSSION / ACTION ITEMS:

- Follow up: Greenwood Drive speed limit A discussion ensued, and Mr. Henry was instructed to price out portable small electronic speed signs for Greenwood Drive, which could be added to next year's budget.
- 2016 Meeting Calendar changes the Clerk made the changes as noted from the July 22nd meeting. Deputy Mayor Meringolo asked if the meeting schedule with the changes be emailed to the Committee in order to check their personal calendars before final approval.

• Funding Options for Development of Central Park (formerly known as the Kurz property)

Committeeman Piserchia noted that trails are now included for the County Open Space Grant monies, so that would be an option along with the Township's Open Space Trust monies and possible private donations.

Deputy Mayor Meringolo agreed and added that monies from the sale of the wastewater plant may infuse additional cash. He also noted that the Visionary Committee recommends hiring specialized Park Architects to design Central Park to maximize the use of the space.

OLD BUSINESS:

Committeeman Dorsi asked for an update on the sidewalk on Main Ave at Northfield. Mr. Henry reported that the Engineer should have his cost analysis done by Monday.

NEW BUSINESS:

NJ American Water is working on the pipes, which break frequently on Pine and High, which prompted the Township Committee to request that Mr. Henry get a list of scheduled projected projects in Long Hill from NJ American Water to better inform the residents.

Announcements/Correspondence:

- August 26th Township Committee meeting is cancelled for lack of a quorum. Ordinance # 361-15 and 360-15 were scheduled for an open public hearing on August 26th. Due to the cancellation of the August 26th meeting, Ordinance 361-15 and Ordinance 360-15 will be carried to the scheduled September 9th, 2015 Township Committee meeting.
- Introduction Letters will be mailed out to all property owners this week outlining the steps which will be taken as part of the Township's re-assessment program which will start this fall. Included in the letter will be a Frequently Asked Questions brochure to help answer any questions you may have as well as contact information for Appraisal Systems, Inc., the company who will be conducting the field inspections associated with this program.

MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC: Remarks and Statements Pertaining to Any Matter

Ms. Jardim – spoke again with regards to the vehicles speeding on Greenwood Drive – There are no stop signs and no road striping on Greenwood Drive. The Committee had spoken with Chief Mazzeo and he increased the police presence on Greenwood and will be issuing tickets in that area as opposed to warnings in an effort to get drivers to slow down. The Committee has asked Mr. Henry to follow up on pricing electronic sensor speed limit signs that can be posted on Greenwood.

Mr. Clapcich asked if Whitebridge Road pot holes could be patched in the interim while waiting for the FLAP grant to be awarded. He also recommended applying for possible flood mitigation grants for the landscaping of the Kurz property to control the flooding on adjacent Morristown Road.

Don Farnell inquired to the status of Karen Dietrich Drive. Mr. Henry noted that the contractor's letter of credit has been called by the Township to Provident Bank for \$80,000, but also noted that the \$80,000 would not be enough to finish the road and that the Township will need to budget to complete the project. Mr. Farnell does not agree that tax payers should have to pay for this road.

Mr. Farnell also voiced his disagreement with Res. 15-255 which awards a consulting contract to Spinelli & Pinto. Mr. Farnell offered his services to the Township Committee for help with the Kurz property design.

Mr. Farnell asked if the Committee was aware that the bid docs for turfing Matthew G. Kantor Memorial Park field state that the fill from the existing park will be transferred to the Kurz property. The Township Committee is aware of the plan and feel the fill will most definitely be needed for the Central Park project.

ADJOURNMENT:

As there was no further business to discuss Committeeman Piserchia made a motion, seconded by Deputy Mayor Meringolo to adjourn. Voice Vote: All in favor. The meeting adjourned at 8:59 PM.
