**AWARDING EMERGENCY CONTRACT TO NATURAL SYSTEMS UTILITIES TO SERVE AS THE TOWNSHIP WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT OPERATOR**

**WHEREAS**, the Township Wastewater Treatment Plan Operator resigned unexpectedly on April 17, 2018; and

**WHEREAS**, N.J.A.C. 7:10A-1.10 requires “. . . every owner of a [wastewater treatment] system [to] employ a licensed operator holding the license prescribed by the Department for that classification of system . . .”; and

**WHEREAS**, N.J.A.C. 7:10A-1.10 goes on to provide that “The licensed operator shall be in charge of the operation of the system . . .”; and

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6 allows a municipality to award an emergency contract



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without public advertising for bids “when an emergency affecting the public health, safety or welfare requires the immediate . . . performance of services . . . ”; and

**WHEREAS**, the applicable Department of Community Affairs regulation set forth at *N.J.A.C. 5:34-6.1* provides that:

“The use of emergency purchasing pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6 or 18A:18A-7 shall be subject to the following requirements:

1. An actual or imminent emergency must exist requiring the immediate delivery of the goods or the performance of the service;

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3. The emergency purchasing procedure may not be used unless the need for the goods or services could not have been reasonably foreseen or the need for such goods or services has arisen notwithstanding a good faith effort on the part of the contracting unit to plan for the purchase of any goods or services required by the contracting unit;

4. The contract shall be of such limited duration as to meet only the immediate needs of the emergency; and

5. Under no circumstances shall the emergency purchasing procedure be used to enter into a multi-year contract” and

**WHEREAS**, Natural Systems Utilities (“NSU”) has served as plant operator since the unexpected resignation of the Township’s previous plant operator; and

**WHEREAS**, NSU has submitted a proposal to continue to serve at the Township Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator through the end of the year, at a cost of \$23,760 per month; and

**WHEREAS**, the need for these services could not have been reasonably foreseen in light of the unexpected resignation of the Township’s plant operator; and

**WHEREAS**, this contract is of a limited duration so as to meet only the immediate needs of the emergency;

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**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** as follows:

1. An emergency contract is hereby awarded to NSU to serve as the Township's Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator at a cost of \$23,750 per month, through December 31, 2018, in accordance with its proposal dated May 18, 2018, the terms of which are incorporated herein by reference.
2. This contract shall be charged to account number 27-2018-0027-0455-1-00101.
3. In accordance with the requirements of "(j)" of *N.J.A.C. 5:34-6.1*, the Township Administrator is hereby directed to notify the Examination and Licensing Unit of NJDEP of the name of the new licensed operator.

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**MAYORAL APPOINTMENT:**

**INTRODUCTION/FIRST READING**

**TOWNSHIP OF LONG HILL  
ORDINANCE #420-18**

**AUTHORIZING THE CLEAN UP OF BLOCK 11301, LOT 3 AND APPROPRIATING \$10,500 FROM THE OPEN SPACE TRUST FUND TO COVER THE COST THEREOF**

**WHEREAS,** the Township has entered into a Letter of Intent to exchange real estate with Parthenon Realty LLC which involves the exchange of a portion of Lot 3 in Block 11301

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owned by the Township (the “Disposal Parcel”) for a portion of Lot 4 in Block 11401 and all of Lot 14 in Block 11401 owned by Parthenon Realty LLC (the “Acquisition Parcel”); and

**WHEREAS**, investigation has revealed that the presence of landscape dump piles on both parcels, as well as an underground storage tank on the Acquisition Parcel; and

**WHEREAS**, the parties have agreed to clean up their own parcels before entering into a formal contract for the proposed land swap; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township has obtained a Summary Letter Report from EcolSciences Inc. dated August 3, 2017, which concluded that “no further investigation is warranted with regard to the historic agricultural use at the site,” and “based on the results of the geophysical survey and historic pesticide investigation, no further investigation is warranted for the site.”;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Long Hill in the County of Morris, New Jersey, as follows:

**Section 1.** The clean-up of the Disposal Parcel as described in the preamble is hereby authorized.

**Section 2.** The sum of \$10,500 to cover the cost thereof, including soft costs, is hereby appropriated from the Township Open Space Trust Fund.

**Section 3.** This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

**NOTICE**

The foregoing ordinance having been introduced and passed on first reading by the Township Committee of the Township of Long Hill, in the County of Morris on Wednesday, May 23, 2018 will be considered for final passage and adoption at a public hearing held at a meeting beginning at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday, June 27th, 2018 at the Municipal Building, 915 Valley Road, Gillette, New Jersey, when and where or at such time and place to which said

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meeting may be adjourned, all persons interested will be given an opportunity to be heard concerning said ordinance.

**MOVED** by: Committeeman Schuler, that Ordinance #420-18 be introduced on first reading and advertised for second reading which is scheduled for the June 27<sup>th</sup>, 2018 Meeting.

**SECONDED** by: Deputy Mayor Dorsi, **ROLL CALL VOTE:** Ayes: Schuler, Dorsi, Piserchia, Abstain: Meringolo.

**DISCUSSION:**

- The DEP representative had a conflict of interest and could not attend this evening's meeting. The Mayor will post the information regarding the TIFA cleanup on line shortly.
- Traffic Advisory Committee – The Committee met on May 21<sup>st</sup> and is recommending the installation of a No Parking zone in a 97' area in front of the fire hydrant on Railroad Ave. Attorney Pidgeon will have an ordinance for introduction at the June 13<sup>th</sup> meeting. The Committee authorized the Planning Board to finalize the parking report and they have agreed that there can be no further parking added to Railroad Avenue because the area is wetland.
- Schoolhouse Bid Proposal – There was a brief discussion about the rental potential for the Old Schoolhouse. Ms. Malool will present additional information at the next meeting.
- Energy Audit – Ms. Malool briefly reviewed the results of the energy audit that had been conducted over the last several months and the results will be put on the website. The Committee will review the suggestions of the audit company and move forward with some changes.

**ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:**

- Kantor Park Trail – The Committee authorized the use of "fine stone dust" as opposed to asphalt for the completion of the trail. The Passaic Valley Park Committee will be applying for a trail grant in 2019.
- Ms. Malool reported that the energy audit company also provided their services to residents to help them identify areas in their homes that can become more energy efficient. There is a reduced fee to the resident and no obligation on the part of the resident to use the energy audit company to address the issues that may be found. The Committee authorized Ms. Malool to prepare an RFP (Lowest Bidder) for these services.
- Ms. Malool reported the Traffic Advisory Committee had reviewed the turning situation onto Lackawanna to avoid the light on Morristown road and had sent a letter to the County to discuss putting in a left hand turn signal at the light on Valley and Morristown Road. The Township would be responsible for covering 30% of the cost of the new light. Ms. Malool will follow up with the Committee when the County responds with the cost of the new light. The Committee also discussed the line of site issue on Long Hill Rd and Mountain Ave. It is the County Engineer's recommendation that approximately 400' of tree line be removed or trimmed back to help with the site line. The Committee authorized this as a possible project for the 2019 budget.

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- Ms. Malool reported the BAN sale had taken place and TD Bank had the lowest bid. The Committee requested that CFO Bahr compile a history of BAN rates for the last 2 years for the next meeting.

**OLD BUSINESS/NEW BUSINESS:**

- Committeeman Dorsi reminded the residents that American Flags can be dropped off at the DPW for proper retirement, thanked the DPW for preparing Stirling Lake for its upcoming season and reminded people who are interested in the Veterans Flag to contact Barbara Grill at [beg51@aol.com](mailto:beg51@aol.com).

- Mario Bonaccorso received clarification regarding the timeline of hiring NSU as the Wastewater Contractors.
- Cathy O’Leary was disappointed that the DEP representative was not at the meeting. She is concerned about conflict of interest between the TIFA project and one of the Planning Board members. Committeeman Dorsi questioned Ms. O’Leary about the relationship of her husband’s firm to superfund site work completed in Jersey City.
- Pam Ogens was also disappointed the DEP representative was not present and was concerned about the lack of follow up by the state on the cleanup of the TIFA site.
