In addition, we've added to our Summer Concert Series this year and we are excited to bring in two additional concerts. On Friday, July 12, from 7 p.m. to 8:30 p.m., we will welcome Dr. K's Motown Revue to Kantor Park on the grass field. Come hear some of your Motown favorites in the park! On Saturday, August 3, from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m., 4 Flight Rock, a 50s-70s rock and roll band, will perform at Stirling Lake. All concerts are FREE for Long Hill residents and members of Stirling Lake.

Registration is open now for our summer camps. In addition to our Summer Rec Camp (grades K-8) and our Little Explorers Pre-School Camp (ages 3-5) we've added a couple new programs. New this year are two afternoon S.T.E.M. camp programs to be held at the Old Millington Schoolhouse building – Engineering Adventure and Video Game Design. Also, by popular demand, Bricks 4 Kidz will be back for All Around LEGO Camp and Superhero Academy LEGO Camp. Administrator's Corner

One of the topics discussed frequently at recent Township Committee meetings and in these newsletters is recycling. As most people know, recycling is required by state statute and most residents do a great job of complying with the law. At a meeting in March, Gary Smalley from Republic Services made a presentation to the Township Committee on the current state of recycling worldwide and its impact on Long Hill residents. Due to a recent ban on accepting recyclables in China, costs associated with recycling have increased dramatically. As a result, now only certain materials will be accepted for recycling.

We encourage residents to continue to recycle but to also ensure that the proper guidelines are being followed. In the coming months, residents who try to recycle improper goods will find their bins have not been picked up and a notice similar to the one shown here. If you find this notice on your recycling container, please remove the improper items and place your container at the curb on your next **regularly scheduled** recycling pickup day.

In order to avoid rejected recycling, please make sure you recycle **only** these items: flattened cardboard, paper, metal cans, plastic bottles and jugs and glass. Make sure all items are clean and dry. Note that plastic bags are never recyclable.

For Long Hill residents, Styrofoam, cooking oil, batteries and light bulbs (and tires for a fee) are recyclable at the DPW yard only, not in curbside recycling.

The parade will be held on Monday, May 27, beginning at 9:30 a.m. The parade will start at the corner of Main Avenue and Mercer Street and will continue north to the front lawn of Central School, where there will be a brief ceremony to honor all those who made the ultimate sacrifice in war so that we all can enjoy the freedoms we have today. Local community groups who would like to march in the parade should contact the Parks & Recreation Department so we can put you into the lineup.

Mosquito Control Hints


With spring here, mosquito's are coming. The Morris County Division of Mosquito Control fights these pesky insects countywide and offers tips to homeowners for keeping mosquitoes at bay near their homes. As mosquitoes breed on or in water, most tips entail eliminating standing water around your home.

Police Your Yard – Remove any standing water, such as in buckets, tire swings and on tarps covering firewood. Clean bird baths every few days and cover rain barrels with screens. Regularly empty collection plates beneath flower pots.

Educate Your Neighbors – Mosquitoes are local. Ask your neighbors to remove standing water, as well.

Educate Yourself – When outside, use EPA-approved and CDC-recommended bug repellants and follow the instructions closely.

If you continue to have a significant problem, call the Division at 973.285.6450 and they'll come out for a home check.



Passaic Valley Park Update

To provide greater access to Passaic Valley Park on the corner of Valley and Plainfield roads, the Township is proposing to exchange a portion of the park with an adjoining property owner. The proposed exchange will transfer slightly more than two acres from the Township to the property owner and more than 7.5 acres from the property owner to the Township.

The exchange is regulated by the NJDEP Green Acres Program under a “disposal” of land process. Requirements include minimum ratios of land and appraised values, which this proposal meets or exceeds. The process also involves an already conducted public hearing and the submission of a pre-application to the DEP that is currently being prepared. The application includes a description of the proposal and property; public hearing transcript; analysis of alternatives, including any raised at the public hearing; and preliminary appraisal information.

After the DEP review, the Township will submit a final application, which will include greater details of all pre-application information, as well as final surveys, deeds, formal appraisals, etc. After DEP reviews the final application, they will submit the application for approval to the State House Commission. The township is working toward a summer submission for State House Commission review. During this time volunteers are mapping out walking trails through the property so residents may start to utilize the new park.

Public Safety

Earlier this year members of the Long Hill Police Department met with all the houses of worship located in the Township to discuss and review their plans for reacting to emergencies – from something as simple as a fire in the kitchen to an incident as serious as an active shooter.

The good news is our religious leaders welcome our assistance. The houses of worship have begun holding regular interfaith gatherings and at one of these meetings police representatives offered a number of tips for improving emergency readiness and for making sure they are not the next target for an active shooter. In addition, we let all the houses of worship know they can request that a Long Hill Police detective visit their facility to perform a free security survey. To request such a visit, simply call 908.647.1800.

The safety of every Long Hill resident is the greatest commitment of the Long Hill Police Department and your preparedness can go a long way toward helping us ensure that goal.

On a related note, it is no surprise there has been an increase in applications for firearms since the tragic events at the Christchurch mosque in New Zealand.
