TOWNSHIP OF LONG HILL ORDINANCE 524-23

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING THE HISTORIC PRESERVATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE AND AMENDING SECTION 2-35 OF THE TOWNSHIP CODE

WHEREAS, the Historic Preservation Advisory Committee has asked the Township Committee to expand its duties:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Long Hill in the County of Morris, New Jersey that Article 2 of the Township Code entitled "Administration" is amended as follows:

Section 1. Subsection 2-35.2 of the Township Code entitled "Responsibilities [of the Historic Preservation Advisory Committee]" is hereby supplemented and amended by adding the following new paragraphs "e" and "f" and renumbering the existing paragraph "f" as paragraph "g," as follows:

§ 2-35.2 Responsibilities.

The Historic Preservation Advisory Committee shall have the responsibility to:

- a. Prepare a survey of historic sites in the Township;
- <u>b.</u> Make recommendations to the Planning Board on the historic preservation plan element of the master plan and on the implications for preservation of historic sites of any other master plan elements:
- Advise the Planning Board on the inclusion of historic sites in the recommended capital improvement program;
- <u>d.</u> Advise the Planning Board and Board of Adjustment on applications for development pursuant to Subsection **2-35.3** of this section;
- e. Advise the Mayor and Township Committee of the need for repairs, preservation, restoration, or upgrades to Township owned historic sites and structures
- f. Upon agreement with the Township Committee regarding the cost and scope of the project, document the historical significance of structures to be demolished, if appropriate.
- g. Carry out such other advisory, educational and informational functions as will promote historic preservation in the Township.

Section 2. Any and all other ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with any of the terms hereof are hereby repealed to such extent as they are so in conflict or inconsistent.

Section 3. In case any article, section or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid in any court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect any other article, section or provision of this ordinance except insofar as the article, section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.

Section 4. This prdinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.
